REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

March 2, 2020

The Dougherty County Commission met in Room 100 of the Albany-Dougherty Government Center on March 2, 2020. Chairman Christopher Cohilas presided. Commissioners present were Victor Edwards, Gloria Gaines, Russell Gray, Lamar Hudgins, Clinton Johnson, and Anthony Jones. Also present were County Administrator Michael McCoy, Assistant County Administrator Scott Addison, County Attorney Spencer Lee, County Clerk Jawahn Ware, other staff and representatives of the media.

After the invocation and Pledge of Allegiance, the Chairman called for approval of the January 27th Regular Meeting and February 10th Work Session minutes.

Commissioner Jones moved for approval. Upon a second by Commissioner Gray, the minutes were unanimously approved.

The Chairman recognized Dr. Charles Ruis, District Health Director Southwest Health District 8-2 to provide an update on the coronavirus also known as COVID-19. Hank Wilson Director of Emergency Preparedness also was in attendance. Dr. Ruis shared facts and encouraged individuals to take the flu shot to reduce the epidemic because the virus is spread via respiratory contact. The most common symptoms are fever, cough and shortness of breath.

The Chairman called for consideration of the purchase of one 2020 Cab Tractor with 7' Rotary Mower for the Public Works Department from the state contract vendor Flint AG & Turf Division (Albany, GA), in the amount of \$68,623.92. Funding is budgeted in SPLOST VI – Storm Drainage Improvements/Equipment.

Commissioner Jones moved for approval. Upon a second by Commissioner Johnson, the motion passed unanimously.

The Chairman called for consideration of the purchase of one 2020 Flex Wing 15' Rotary Mower for the Public Works Department from the state contract vendor Flint AG & Turf Division (Albany, GA), in the amount of \$20,311.06. Funding is budgeted in SPLOST VI – Storm Drainage Improvements/Equipment.

Commissioner Jones moved for approval. Upon a second by Commissioner Edwards, the motion passed unanimously.

The Chairman called for consideration of the purchase of two 2020 F-150 4x2 Super Crew Cab Trucks for the Public Works Department from Sunbelt Ford Town (Albany, Ga) in the amount of \$62,820.40. The purchase will be "piggy-backed" from the City of Albany's December 2019 award. Funding is budgeted in SPLOST VI – Storm Drainage Improvements/Equipment.

Commissioner Jones moved for approval. Upon a second by Commissioner Johnson, the motion passed unanimously.

The Chairman called for consideration of a resolution providing for the acceptance and execution of the contract to complete Phase II of the Radium Springs Trailhead Project from the lowest most responsive and responsible vendor, HTS Construction of Albany, GA in the amount of \$284,544.69 subject to the execution of the contract by the County Administrator. Funding is budgeted in SPLOST VII.

Commissioner Jones moved for approval. Upon a second by Commissioner Edwards, the motion passed unanimously. Resolution 20-010 is entitled:

The annual cost is \$69,045 subject to the execution of the contract by the County Administrator. Funding will be budgeted in the Risk Management Fund.

Commissioner Gray moved for approval. Upon a second by Commissioner Johnson, the motion passed unanimously. Resolution 20-011 is entitled:

The Chairman called for consideration of the proposed board appointment. Upon nomination by Commissioner Johnson, the recommendation for Lisa Harrell, Dean of Academic Affairs, Albany Technical College, was accepted to replace Dr. Michara Delaney to the Keep Albany Dougherty Beautiful (KADB) Board for a fill a three-year term ending December 31, 2022.

The Chairman called for consideration of a resolution supporting the requests of the Chehaw Park Authority for local legislation revising the former Act creating such Authority.

Commissioner Hudgins moved for approval. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion. The motion passed six ayes and one nay by Commissioner Gaines. Resolution 20-014 is entitled:

WORK SESSION MINUTES

March 9, 2020

The Dougherty County Commission met in Room 100 of the Albany-Dougherty Government Center on March 9, 2020. Chairman Christopher Cohilas presided. Commissioners present were Victor Edwards, Gloria Gaines, Russell Gray, Lamar Hudgins, Clinton Johnson and Anthony Jones. Also present were County Administrator Michael McCoy, Assistant County Administrator Scott Addison, County Attorney Spencer Lee, Administrative Specialist Bristeria Hope, other staff and representatives of the media. County Clerk Jawahn Ware was absent.

The Chairman recognized Public Works Director Larry Cook and Assistant Public Works Director Chuck Mathis to announce the 2020 Georgia Chapter APWA awards received. Dougherty County Public Works received the Disaster or Emergency Construction/Repair Award for the Radium Springs Subdivision Road Improvements and Project Engineer Jeremy Brown was recognized as the Chapter Engineering and Technical Manager of the Year. Mr. Mathis informed the Commission that Mr. Brown would officially receive his award on July 9th. Commissioner Gaines asked if the rewards were placed on display in the Administration office. Mr. McCoy informed her that typically individuals who received awards would normally take them to display in their office.

The Chairman recognized the 2020 Snicker Marathon water station volunteers for their hard work and dedication at the Dougherty County water station.

The Chairman asked the Commission to review the minutes of the February 17th Regular Meeting and February 24th Work Session.

The Chairman called for a discussion of a recommendation to purchase one 40 Ton Articulated Dump Truck for the Solid Waste Department from Flint Equipment Company (Albany, GA), in the amount of \$495,415. Funding is budgeted in the Solid Waste Capital Outlay. Assistant County Administrator Scott Addison addressed. Solid Waste Director Campbell Smith and City of Albany Buyer Tina Strassenberg were present. Mr. Addison informed the Commission that this was a normal scheduled replacement.

The Chairman called for a discussion of a recommendation from the Recreation Committee to implement Phase I of the Radium Springs Master Plan. Recreation Committee Chairman Clinton Johnson, County Administrator Michael McCoy and Consultant Ron Huffman addressed. Mr. McCoy recommended that Phase I was implemented and that the focus would be on adding hook-ups for vendors, food-truck parking, canoe repairs, the beach and waterfront plaza repairs with a preliminary cost of \$396,034. If this is approved by the Commission, then implementation would start within the next three weeks upon receiving permission from the state. Chairman Cohilas would like to update our state delegation on this implementation which could possibly open an opportunity for co-investment. Commissioner Gray suggested that line 1 item be cut out of Phase I project for lane removal of vegetation. This could possibly eliminate additional cost that the County did not budget for. Funding for this project is from SPLOST V under infrastructure improvements. Commissioner Edwards wanted to emphasis the importance of the County being good stewards of the taxpayer's dollars in funding with Phase I. Mr. McCoy stated that budget numbers were not final and he would ask for permission to allocate funding if needed. After a lengthy discussion, Chairman Cohilas commended the Recreation Committee for the hard work and well thought out process with Phase I. Commissioner Gray suggested that an exploratory panel be developed about the future needs of the hydrilla operations. Commissioner Johnson clarified that it was already being considered.

The Chairman called for a discussion of a recommendation from Human Resources to accept the 2020 Georgia County Internship Program (GCIP) Grant from the ACCG Georgia Civic Affairs Foundation in the amount of \$2,607.60. The grant will provide a summer internship for the CDBG Disaster Recovery Program. County Administrator Michael McCoy and HR Director Dominique Hall addressed. Mr. McCoy said that the selected intern would have the opportunity to learn disaster relief and administrative duties. Ms. Hall mentioned that the process would be based from selecting candidates through advertisement on the County website, ACCG website and other recruitment efforts. The preference is for a candidate on a master level. Commissioner Jones wanted to aim the internship toward students who were in need of funds to help purchase books and other essential needs.

The Chairman called for a discussion to review and consider a request from Georgia Power Company providing for the execution of a Utility Relocation Agreement between Dougherty County, Georgia and Georgia Power Company relative to relocating several power poles on Camellia Drive in Radium Springs. County Engineer Jeremy Brown addressed. Attorney Lee said that Georgia Power expedited the relocation of some poles in 2019 for Dougherty County. This is the formal paperwork that needs to be signed and handled accordingly.

The Chairman called for a discussion to consider for use the Dougherty County Nuisance Abatement Resolution No 02-034 to address dilapidated properties located at 2902, 2912, 2914 and 2916 Leary Road. County Attorney Spencer Lee addressed. Attorney Lee said that the County Commission had to pass a resolution to take a look at the properties and make an assessment to bring them up to code. If not, they would be considered dilapidated and taken to court which is considered the first phase of the process.

Commissioner Jones expressed his concern for a traffic light that needs to be placed near Georgia Pacific on Sylvester Road. Mr. McCoy stated that the GDOT had been contacted in reference to this concern. Chairman Cohilas asked that a letter of request for Georgia Pacific be written with his signature and be presented to GDOT. He also mentioned that a budget was already available with allocated funds. Chairman Cohilas asked that Mr. McCoy stay in contact with Dr. Ruiz for recent updates regarding the coronavirus. Commissioner Edwards asked that staff inform DNR Fisheries Management Supervisor Rob Weller on any future discussion about the Radium Springs Master Plan implementation.

After there was no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting adjourned at 11:00 a.m.

Statement of Issue

Dougherty County Public Works is seeking approval of the annual LMIG Safety Action Plan for striping and Raised Pavement Markers (RPMs) on approximately 21.62 miles of road within Dougherty County.

History/Facts and Issues

Dougherty County Public Works has the need to stripe and install RPMs on approximately 21.62 miles of roads in the county. Two bids were obtained from Peek Pavement Marking of Columbus, GA and Mid State Construction and Striping of Perry, GA, with the highest quote being \$128,281.50. Public Works is asking approval to award the contract to the lowest bidder, Peek Pavement Marking in the amount of \$84,597.00.

Recommended Action

Recommend Dougherty County Commission approves the award of the contract to Peek Pavement Marking of Columbus, GA in the amount of \$84,597.00 for striping and RPMs on roads within the county.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Fleming/Gaissert Road MSW Landfill Waste Mining Evaluation Study

March 13, 2020

PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

The CLIENT operates the Fleming/Gaissert Road Municipal Solid Waste Landfill (MSWL) under solid waste permit number 047-014D(SL). The initial portion of the landfill consists of unlined, trench-style cells number 1 through 6. The even-numbered cells are divided from the odd numbered cells by an area that contains stormwater and leachate conveyance structures. The unlined waste cells have experienced groundwater issues and methane migration issues for which a volunteer landfill gas extraction system was installed. Although progress has been made with controlling methane migration and groundwater issues, CLIENT is interested in evaluating excavation and relocation of the existing waste in cells 1 through 6, recovering the air space of cells 1 through 6 with Subtitle D liner systems, and increasing the MSW landfill total air space by connecting the current lined area (Cells 7 through 12) to the reclaimed area. Several groundwater wells and methane monitoring probes, leachate and stormwater conveyance structures, and access roads will be impacted by the possible redesign of the facility. Reclaiming the soils used for disposal operations in the unlined cells may provide significant operational soils for active disposal operations in the lined area during the reclamation process.

SCOPE OF WORK

CONSULTANT has separated the scope of work to complete the Waste Mining Evaluation Study into several tasks. Specific tasks will include the following:

Task 1. – Preliminary Design of Reclaimed Cells 1 through 6

During this task, CONSULTANT will develop up to three conceptual designs for evaluation and review by CLIENT. Conceptual design(s) will be evaluated on maximizing the airspace regained from reclaiming cells 1 through 6. Other considerations may include but not be limited to:

- Impacts to the existing landfill-gas-to-energy (LFGTE) project;
- Groundwater wells, methane probe, leachate and stormwater management system impacts;
- Volume of airspace gained and potential value of that airspace;
- Amount of existing lined landfill (cells 7 through 12) consumed by wastes relocated from the unlined area;
- Amounts of reusable soils gained from the reclamation process; and
- Overall operational access.

Task 2.– Engineers Estimate of Costs to Reclaim Cells 1 through 6

Upon selection of the conceptual design for the revised MSW Landfill footprint and elevation by the CLIENT, CONSULTANT will look at probable costs and benefits of the reclamation project. Areas to be examined in determining costs and benefits will include but not be limited to:

- Waste screening;
- Groundwater and methane monitoring point re-locations;
- Cells 7 through 12 leachate conveyance system modifications;
- Reclaimed lined area leachate collection and conveyance;
- Stormwater management;
- Additional landfill staff requirements; and
- Additional landfill equipment requirements.

Task 3. – Waste Mining Study Report

Upon completion of the project, CONSULTANT will prepare a Waste Mining Study Report for submittal to CLIENT. CONSULTANT assumes that others will provide us the project survey documentation within that time frame. The report will include:

- A narrative describing the scope of work;
- Results of the conceptual design evaluation developed in Task 1; and
- Evaluation of probable costs and benefits to the CLIENT developed in Task 2.

FUNDAMENTAL ASSUMPTIONS

BETWEEN

Dougherty County, acting by and through its Board of Commissioners, hereinafter called the **COUNTY**, and the Department of Transportation, an agency of the State of Georgia, hereinafter called the **DEPARTMENT**.

RELATIVE TO

The **COUNTY** is requesting to install four (4) new 187W LED luminaries on four (4) existing poles by Permit No. 1212475 along State Route 3/Liberty Expressway at State Route 133/Moultrie Road intersection, City of Albany, GA, Dougherty County.

I. IT IS THE INTENTION OF THE PARTIES:

A. That the **COUNTY**, only to the extent that it may be bound by contracts that may hereafter be entered into, shall be responsible for the following:

1. The **COUNTY** shall Install, Locate, Provide the Energy, Operate, Maintain and Design additional roadway/pedestrian lighting in accordance with the Georgia Department of Transportation's Design Policy Manual,

The **COUNTY** shall at all times indemnify and save harmless the **DEPARTMENT** and the State of Georgia, to the extent allowed by law, from any and all responsibility for damages or liability, or both, which may result from the installation, construction, reconstruction, operation, maintenance or repair, or any combination of any of the foregoing.

4. The **COUNTY** assumes full responsibility for the requirements of the Georgia Utility Facility Protection Act.

II. IT IS FURTHER AGREED, that the DEPARTMENT, only to the extent that it may be bound by contracts which may hereafter be entered into, shall reserve the right to remove the aforementioned lighting upgrades in the event that the COUNTY elects to de-energize or fails to properly maintain any individual component within the systems or the complete system(s) including poles, mast arms, luminaires, foundations and associated wiring. In addition, the **DEPARTMENT** reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to remove or replace any lighting upgrades where the public safety is at any time compromised by the actions or inactions of the **COUNTY**.

III. IT IS FURTHER AGREED, that this Agreement shall remain in effect for a period of fifty (50) years.

IV. IT IS FURTHER AGREED, the covenants herein contained shall, except as otherwise provided accrue to the benefit of and be binding upon the successors and assigns of the parties hereto.

This document is a **Memorandum of Agreement** expressing the present intentions of the parties. Nothing contained herein shall require the undertaking of any act, project, study, analysis, or any other activity by any party until a contract for such activity is executed. Nor shall this document require the expenditure of any funds by any party until a contract authorizing such expenditure is executed.

However, nothing contained herein shall be construed to prohibit any party's undertaking any act, project, study, analysis, or any other activity, which the party is required by law to contract to undertake as part of any other program, which fulfills some function shown herein as intended to be performed by the party undertaking such act, project, study, analysis, or any other activity. A RESOLUTION ENTITLED

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE APPROVAL OF A WAIVER OF CERTAIN PENALTIES AND INTEREST BY THE DOUGHERTY COUNTY TAX DIRECTOR RELATIVE TO BOTH THE FILING OF PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX RETURNS DUE APRIL 1, 2020 AND TO THE APRIL 1, 2020 DEADLINE FOR PAYING PERSONAL PROPERTY AD VALOREM TAXES ON MOBILE HOMES; REPEALING RESOLUTIONS OR PARTS OF RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, President Donald J. Trump declared a National Emergency as a result of the spread of the novel coronavirus disease known as COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 14, 2020, Georgia Governor Brian P. Kemp also declared a Public Health State of Emergency due to the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the measures implemented in response to the COVID-19 outbreak and in response to the National Emergency and Georgia Public Health State of Emergency have resulted in major disruptions to all aspects of life, including limitations on the availability of some county government services and operations, limitations on public gatherings, and self-isolation steps that have limited the ability of citizens to interact and conduct business with various county government offices; and

WHEREAS, state laws impose penalties and/or interest obligations on taxpayers who either fail to make timely payment of taxes or fail to timely file certain documents including the filing of personal property tax returns due by April 1, 2020 and the payment of ad valorem taxes on mobile homes due by April 1, 2020;

WHEREAS, O.C.G.A. § 48-5-242 authorizes a county governing authority to delegate to the county tax commissioner the authority to waive, in whole or in part, the collections of penalties and interest assessed as a result of a taxpayer's failure to comply with laws relating to ad valorem taxation, where such failure was due to reasonable cause and not due to gross or willful neglect or disregard of the law; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Dougherty County finds that the unique circumstances surrounding the COVID-19 National Emergency and Georgia Public Health Emergency may constitute due cause for failure by some Dougherty County Taxpayers to either file personal property tax returns by April 1, 2020 or pay ad valorem taxes on mobile homes by April 1, 2020.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Dougherty County, Georgia and it is hereby resolved by same as follows:

SECTION I The Board of Commissioners of Dougherty County, Georgia hereby approve the waiver of penalties and interest on past due ad valorem taxes subject to collections on mobile

homes where the original deadline for payment of such taxes falls on April 1, 2020. This waiver of penalties and interest shall be valid through and including June 1, 2020, after which date, all penalties and interest as provided for under Georgia State Law shall accrue and be payable.

SECTION II The Board of Commissioners of Dougherty County, Georgia hereby approve the waiver of penalties and interest for failure to file personal property tax returns due April 1, 2020. This waiver of penalties and interest shall be valid through and including June 1, 2020, after which date, all penalties and interest as provided for under Georgia State Law shall accrue and be payable.

SECTION III The Authority to make the final determination as to which properties and taxpayers will be granted the exemptions from penalties and interest is hereby delegated to the Dougherty County Tax Director on a case by case basis and said determination shall be based on reasonable causes and not due to gross or willful neglect or disregard of the law by said taxpayer.

SECTION IV All Resolutions or parts of Resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION V This Resolution shall take effect on the date of adoption by the Board of Commissioners of Dougherty County, Georgia.
